Stay on Top of Your Library Account!

Students are encouraged to regularly check their Destiny accounts to see what materials are checked out and if any fines are owed. Staying informed helps avoid surprises, especially during senior year and at senior checkout time. A quick check now can save time and stress later!

What Happens If a Device Is Damaged?

1st Incident - Awareness Notification

- . A letter is sent home with details of the
- . The student must complete an online Device Care Refresher Module (15-20)
- . There is no loss of take-home privileges at this time, but the incident is logged.

2nd Incident - Support & Guidance

- · A meeting is scheduled with a parent/guardian and school staff.
- . The student and parent/quardian sign a Device Responsibility Agreement.
- . Depending on the situation, the student may temporarily lose takehome access

3rd Incident - Device Use Becomes In-School Only


- . The student loses the ability to take the device home for the rest of the school
- · The device can only be used on campus during school hours.
- · A final review meeting is held to discuss future eligibility for take-home

STUDENT TECHNOLOGY

This year, FUSD has implemented a new student device success plan that includes consequences for students who damage their devices. The fine structure has not changed.

Additionally, students will now need to go to a FLATS center if they are in need of a new device or to swap out a broken or slow device. We are no longer given enough to habitually swap them out on site.
