





- Only required for Private Colleges, Honors Programs and possibly scholarships
- Please email your counselor at least 2 weeks before you need a letter of recommendation
- If using common app or online recommendation, please enter counselor's/teacher's email correctly then check with them to make sure they received it.

Passwords & Deadlines

Financial Aid (FAFSA)

- FAFSA application opens on October 1st
- FAFSA Priority Deadline is March 2nd
- Student & Parent need FSA ID to electronically sign FAFSA

What is Financial Aid?

Tess Sea Manager II College & Career Readiness "Financial Aid" is money that is given (or sometimes lent) to students in order to help pay for their education.

College & Career Readiness These are considered "external" funds because they are coming from outside the family.

Types of Financial Aid

Program	Notes
Grants (Free money)	Federal & State Grants & Institutions/Systems
Work-Study (Earned money)	Helps college students with financial need get part- time jobs- this aid is first come-first-serve. Students must apply early to be guaranteed work study.
Loans (Borrowed money)**	Subsidized, Unsubsidized, Parent Loans, etc. For Dreamers- state campus loan only up to , 4k/year, \$20,000 total over four years
Scholarships	Agencies, companies, foundations, employers, colleges

**Loans are the only type of financial aid that will need to be paid back. Students won't be given any loans that they didn't accept and sign for. Unless a parent intentionally takes out a parent loan, they are not responsible for paying back any of their student's financial aid (nor are they obligated to pay for any college expenses)

CA Community College Promise Grant	Waives tuition and fees at CCC for eligible CA residents
CSU State University Grant	Grant that covers partial or all tuition costs for students who are not already receiving a Cal Grant (undergrads and graduates students)
UC Blue & Gold Opportunity Plan	Ensures that eligible CA undergrads at a UC campus with an annual family income of up to 80K have their system wide tuition and fees covered.

Scholarships

- In reality, is there are few "full ride" scholarships out there. Most come directly from colleges as athletic scholarships through an honors programs, but there are a few "big ticket" scholarships from companies and foundations like the GATES, Dell and Coca-Cola scholarships
- There are many \$500 and \$1000 awards out there. A combination of scholarships, or scholarships plus grants, can make a significant dent in college expenses.
- As mentioned previously, scholarships may be offered by:
 - Companies like Coca-Cola or EECU
 - Employers like the Wonderful Company
 - Organizations or Foundations (like AMAE or the Foundation for FUSD)
 - ▶ Colleges like Fresno State, Fresno City, UC, the HBCUs, and private schools nationwide.
- Applying for scholarship takes WORK, so the more time and effort dedicated to researching and applying, the greater chance of multiple awards.

Scholarships Continued

Best practices

- Research scholarships online and register with scholarship websites like Fastweb, Cappex and Scholarships.com
- Check the FUSD College Readiness (CCR) website as well as your high school's own scholarship list regularly.
- Check your school email frequently as counselors and district personnel will share opportunities with you.
- Ask for letters of recommendation at least four weeks before applications are due and ask people (ideally teachers) who are familiar with your academic skills and/or other achievements.
- Write a general essay/statement that can be revised for a variety of applications
 - ▶ Be sure to include:
 - ► A little about yourself and your background
 - Your future plans for education and career
 - Any obstacles or challenges you have faced
 - Why you need financial assistance and how you will use it.
- Keep track of deadlines and submit/mail applications on time.
- Look at the colleges you are considering and their website's scholarship page do they have an honors program with a scholarship? Is their general scholarship application built into the admissions application or is it a separate?
- Apply to the FUSD Foundation Scholarship (opens October 1 2025) This is ONLY for FUSD students meaning the probability of winning is much greater than national scholarships. There is no GPA requirement so it's not just the valedictorians who are winning! This past Spring over 300 awards of \$1000 or more were given out,

Need-Based > vs. Merit-Based

Grants and Scholarships can be need-based, merit-based, or a combination of the two.

- Need-based looks at income and family size/situation
- Merit-based usually looks at GPA/academic success but can also be awarded based on a demonstrated talent/skill, community service, or other accomplishments.
- Examples
 - Pell Grant is need-based, using family income and household size
 - ► Cal Grant is a combination of merit and need, using GPA and family income information
 - ► The FUSD scholarship considers need and merit
 - Athletic scholarships are merit-based, looking at talent/skill
 - The Coca-Cola Scholarship is merit-based, looking at leadership in the community



What is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)?

Collects

Student and parent income, tax, assets, and household information

Determines

Eligibility for needbased student financial aid from:

- Federal government
- State government
- Most colleges and universities

Calculates

Student Aid Index (SAI), a measure of the family's financial strength

What is an FSA ID?

An FSA ID is an account username and password associated with your Social Security number, name, & DOB. It serves as your login to FAFSA and legal electronic signature.

When to create?

NOW! It is recommended that FSA IDs are created and verified before completing the FAFSA.

Who needs one?

Every contributor will need an FSA ID to access the FAFSA.

A contributor is anyone who is required to provide information on the FAFSA: Student, Student's Parent(s):

One or both parents depending on marital and 2024 tax filing status

Notes

*If parent(s) has an existing FSA ID account, they do not need to create a new one (but may need to take some time to retrieve existing username and password as the system will not allow a second account)
*"Parent" refers to biological, adoptive, or married stepparent

What's next?

- <u>Users with SSN</u>: Your FSA ID should be immediately verified
- <u>Users without SSN</u>: If your FSA ID was not immediately verified, submit required documentation and monitor email for verification
- Save your StudentAid.Gov (FSA ID) sheet in a safe place
- 2026-2027 FAFSA/CADAA expected to open by October 1st
- Your school will announce FAFSA/CADAA workshop events

Information needed to complete the FAFSA if applicable:

- Student and parent verified StudentAid.Gov accounts (FSA IDs)
- Student and parent(s) Social Security numbers
- Alien Registration Number if eligible nonresident
- Student and Parents Income information
 - 2024 Federal Income Tax Returns/W-2s
 - Untaxed income (child support received)
 - Records of Assets (Savings/Checking Accounts, investments, businesses, farms)
 - List of Federal Benefits received 2023 or 2024 (SNAP/SSI/WIC/MEDICAL/etc.)
