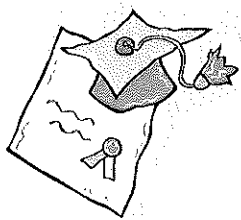

Friday May 29th, 2026

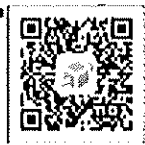

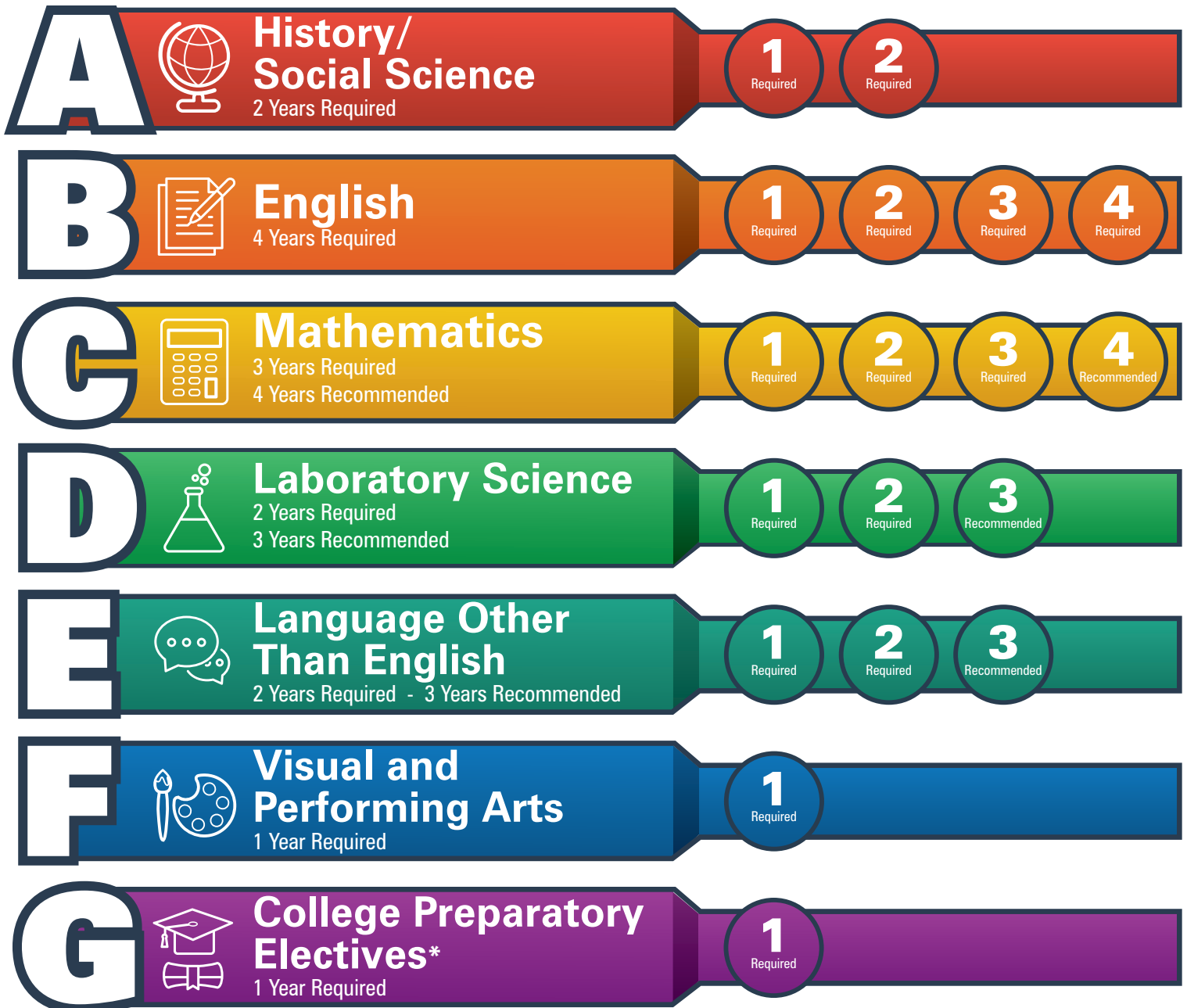

Courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Additional coursework beyond the minimum requirements is strongly recommended.

Financial Aid (FAFSA) Information

Why should I complete a FAFSA?

- Many students choose not to apply for FAFSA because they believe they do not qualify for aid but in fact, most Americans are eligible for some aid.
- Even if you do not qualify for grants, the FAFSA can qualify you for work study and low interest loans.
- Sometimes situations change and you can appeal to the financial aid department for more aid. You must complete a FAFSA to be considered.
- Many scholarships require students to complete a FAFSA. - Community College is free to students who complete a FAFSA, regardless of their income.

- It is important that you do not use your high school email address as you may not have access to it once you graduate. If you do not have a personal email, open an account on outlook.com, yahoo.com, gmail.com, etc.

☐ Social Security Number (SSN) or other Residency Information

- If you have an SSN, the college will need it to match the information on your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Applying without entering your SSN will affect your financial aid.
- If you are undocumented or do not have a SSN, you will follow the directions to submit without one.
- If you are not a US citizen and have a permanent resident card, you will need to know the number, date of issue and expiration of your card.

Reminders

Application Workshop – Information needed to successfully complete the application: home address, phone number, personal email address, social security number or permanent resident card, and transcript (English/math junior year grades).

Site Visit – Students can meet with an FCC staff member on one of the scheduled site visit days to complete their application, submit a name change, and submit a missing social security number.

Orientation Workshop – Orientation is mandatory for students who will attend FCC.

Freshman Application Checklist

When you're ready to begin your application to the CSU, be sure you have these items on hand:

- ☐ **Unofficial transcripts (both high school and college transcripts, if applicable)** You'll be asked to enter all the courses you've completed on your CSU application; those that are currently in progress; and any you plan to take. Transcripts will be requested by campuses as needed.
- ☐ **Your Social Security number**, if you have one.
- ☐ **Your citizenship status**
- ☐ **Credit card or PayPal account** Application fees are due at time of submission.
- ☐ **Annual income** Your parents' if you are a dependent; your income if you are independent
- ☐ **Educational Program, Work and Extracurricular Participation Information** You will need to provide the years you participated in college preparation programs and your average number of hours per week of work and/or participation in extracurricular activities.
- ☐ **Information needed to apply to EOP (if applying)** See the [Apply to EOP website](#) for information about materials needed to complete the optional EOP application.
- ☐ **Test scores** Optional; if you have taken or plan to take the ACT, SAT, AP, IB exams, you may include the information on the application. Reporting test scores is not required. SAT and ACT scores will not be used for determining who gets admitted into the CSU. If you are accepted, the campus will use official test scores to for placement into mathematics and English courses.
- ☐ **California statewide student ID** Optional; every K-12 student in a California public school is assigned an ID number. The number should be printed on your transcript.

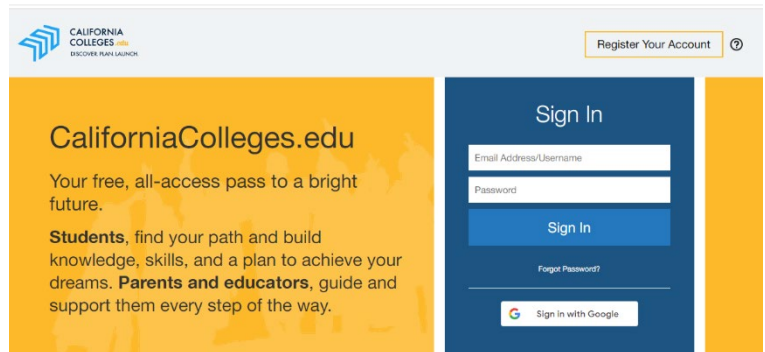

DO

DO visit the [Dates and Deadlines](#) page to see **what programs are available** at each CSU campus since this information can change each application cycle.

DO complete your **Extended Profile** correctly. Make sure you are selecting "First Bachelor's" degree. Need help? Visit the [Help Center](#). The customer support team is here to help with any issues you may have.

DO review the [Freshman Application Guide](#) and the [First-Time Freshman Guidance](#) page for **help filling out your application**.

DO review the [Fee Waiver Checklist](#) to see if you may be eligible for an **application fee waiver** prior to submitting.

Ready to submit? DO first, stop and **review your application carefully**. After you submit, you will not be able to make changes. Be sure to check that you selected the CSU campus(es) you intended to apply to.

DON'T

DON'T start your **application late**. Instead, take your time and submit **early** to avoid stress.

DON'T create your Cal State Apply account with an **email you rarely use**. Instead, provide an email address you check regularly since official communications about the application process are sent via email.

DON'T fill in your application **from memory**. Instead, be sure to have a copy of your unofficial high school transcripts to enter your courses and match A-G. Have an **official** college transcript for college credit, if applicable.

DON'T leave out your **in progress (currently taking)** high school courses. These will be used to calculate your total years earned towards the A-G requirements.

DON'T enter high school courses that **do not meet an A-G requirement**. Instead, only enter high school courses that can be matched to A-G. Reminder: ALL college credit should be entered, even if not taken for A-G.

Getting started

This worksheet is designed to help first-year UC applicants start the writing process for the personal insight questions. Additional suggestions can be found on the [UC admission website](#).

What are the Personal Insight Questions?

These questions are about getting to know *you* — your life experience, interests and accomplishments. Think of your responses as a conversation with the admissions office. Be open. Be reflective. Find your individual voice and express it.

While this section of the application is just one part we consider when making our admission decision, it helps provide context for the rest of your application.

The basics

- You have 8 questions to choose from. You must respond to any 4 of the 8 questions.
- Each response is limited to a maximum of 350 words.
- Which questions you choose to answer is entirely up to you, but you should select questions that are most relevant to your experience and that best reflect your individual circumstances.
- All questions are given equal consideration, which means there is no advantage or disadvantage to choosing certain questions over others. The questions are numbered, not ranked.
- Responses should explore your life and your accomplishments. When sharing examples, explain why they are relevant to the person you are today. The majority of your response should be about the present and/or recent past.

How to use this worksheet:

Read the questions, then write a draft for four personal insight questions. Make yourself the focus of each response.

Edit for content (facts about yourself) as the UC admissions reader is not looking at style or structure in your response.

Remember, there is no right or wrong topic to share in a personal insight question response.

The questions

1. Describe an example of your leadership experience in which you have positively influenced others, helped resolve disputes, or contributed to group efforts over time.

- Was there a time when you stepped up and took the role of leader in a group, team, family and/or work setting? Briefly describe the experience, then explore what that experience meant to you.
- How did you grow from that leadership experience? What, if any, impact did that have in other places in your life?

Tip: We do not need a definition of leadership. We are not asking *if* you have a leadership role or title.

2. Every person has a creative side, and it can be expressed in many ways: problem solving, original and innovative thinking, and artistically, to name a few. Describe how you express your creative side.

- Give an example of your creativity (do not limit yourself by conventional definitions).
- Was there ever a problem where your imagination and intuition guided you to the solution? What was the problem, how did you arrive at a solution, and what was the outcome?
- Do you have a creative passion? What have you gained from this passion that has affected other parts of your life or the life of those around you?

Tip: We do not have a definition of creativity, nor do we need you to limit your own idea of creativity.

3. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?

- List what you consider your talents or skills.
- Which one of these talents or skills is the most meaningful or important to you and why? Does the talent come naturally or have you worked hard to develop this talent or skill?

Tip: You may have always had this talent or skill but we hope you will focus your answer on the present or recent past when it relates to this talent or skill.

4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.

- Feel free to speak about an opportunity and/or a barrier. An opportunity could have come due to a barrier. Also, it is okay if you experience one and not the other.
- Are you engaged in educational or mentorship programs, or community-based organizations? Do you consider these opportunities? If so, what have you gained from the experience?
- Have you had to supplement your coursework online, at a community college/university or through another school?
- Are you in a magnet, academy or special curriculum at your school? Did you apply or were you pre-enrolled in the special curriculum?

Tip: We do not compare students to one another. Your response could set context for the reader who is looking at the academic history section of your application.

5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?

- Have you had a difficult experience in your life? How did you get through it? Who are you today because of that time in your life? What did you learn from the experience?
- If you're currently working your way through the challenge, what are you doing now and does that affect different aspects of your life?

Tip: While your challenge can be personal, we are asking how it impacted your high school academic achievement.

6. Think about an academic subject that inspires you. Describe how you have furthered this interest inside and/or outside of the classroom.

- Does this academic interest relate to activities or interest outside the classroom?
- Might the academic area tie in some way to your major or career path? If so, how and why is that important to you?
- What sparks your desire to learn?

Tip: We are not limiting you to traditional academic subjects or those in core academic areas.

7. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?

- You saw a problem. What motivated you to act? What did you learn from your effort?
- Did you contribute to a positive change at your school or in your community? What steps have you taken to accomplish this? If you worked in a group you need to focus on your tasks, your role, and/or your responsibilities.

Tip: Even small changes can have a big impact. Admissions readers cannot click on links or search for your accomplishment online. You need to explain your accomplishment without external factors.

8. Beyond what has already been shared in your application, what do you believe makes you a strong candidate for admission to the University of California?

- Look at your transcript, resume and daily routine. Is there anything that you need to clarify, explain or elaborate on which we won't find in another PIQ?
- What did we not ask in the application that reflects on who you are as a student inside and/or outside of the classroom?

Tip: UC does not review unsolicited supplemental information (transcripts, letters of recommendation or resumes). Think of this question as a chance to add context or clarification about what we will find in your application.

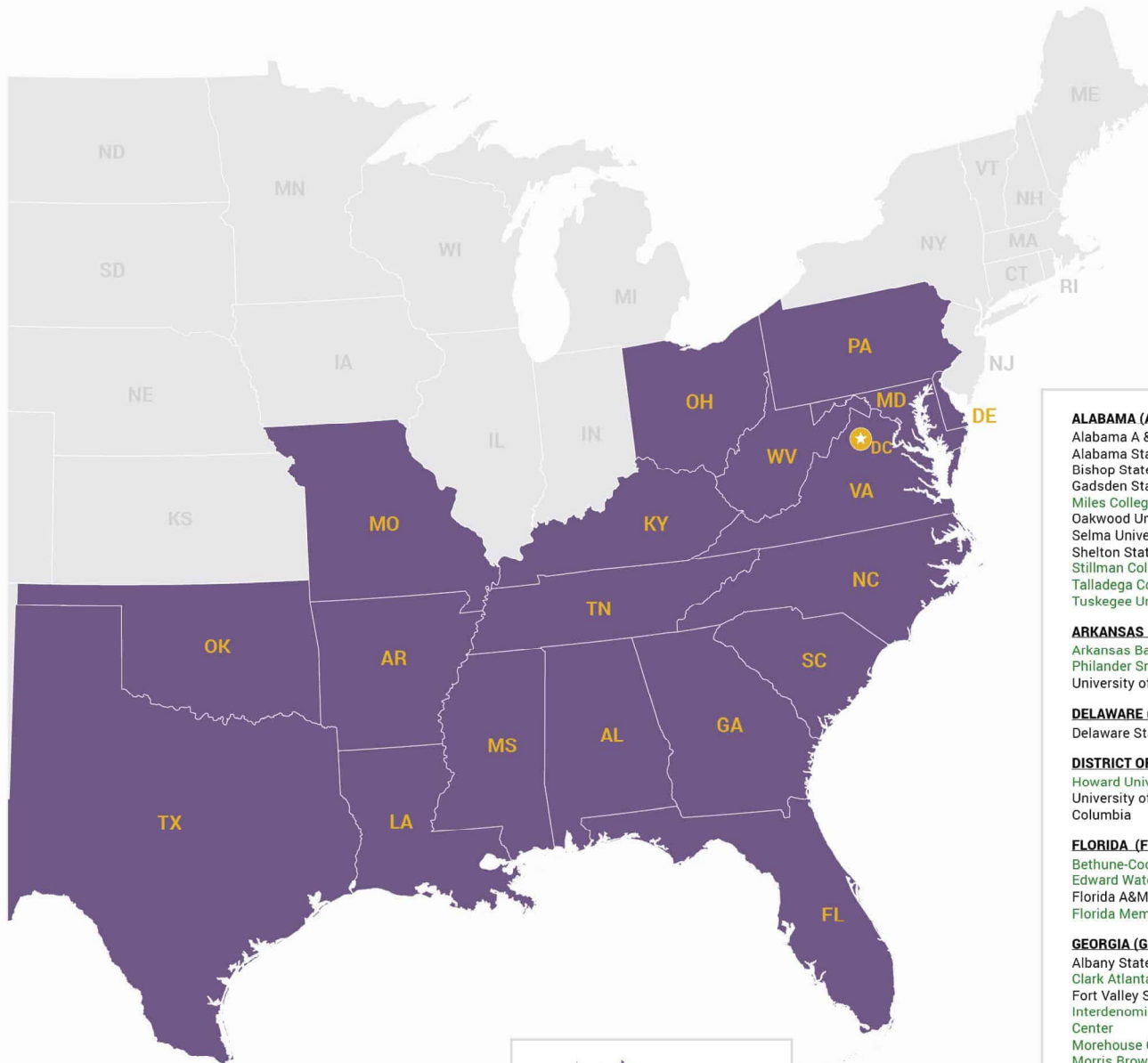
